Board Meeting

On October 20, 2025, the Tallahassee Collegiate Academy (TCA) Board of Trustees meeting was called to order by Trustee Karen Moore at 6:00 p.m.

Members Present: Board Chair Karen Moore, Trustees Randy Pople, Kim Kelling, and James Taylor.

COMMENTS:

- i. **Board Chair** Trustee Moore opened by welcoming all attendees and thanking them for attending the meeting. Trustee Moore highlighted her appreciation for everything the faculty, staff, and leadership are doing over at the Academy.
- ii. **Board Members -** The Board Members shared their reflections on the recent Open House event. Trustee Kelling expressed excitement at seeing parents and students in attendance and was impressed by the newly renovated spaces designed for student comfort and engagement. She highlighted the band's performance as a standout moment, noting the strong school spirit and excellent turnout. Trustee Moore thanked her for representing the Board of Trustees. Trustee Moore also commended the active engagement of families, while Trustee Taylor shared appreciation for parent participation emphasizing that TCA values parent feedback. Trustee Pople also attended the Open House event and echoed the positive sentiment, expressing appreciation for the strong engagement among teachers, students, and families.
- iii. **Principal's Report** Principal Oliveri provided the Principal's Report and began with a special presentation honoring Mrs. Flood as the 2025-2026 School-Related Employee of the Year, and Katie Seitzinger as the 2025-2026 Teacher of the Year. Dr. Oliveri shared several campus activities including the Student of the Month initiative, which celebrates one student per grade level for consistent character and positive growth mindset rather than solely academic achievement; the "Wings of Gratitude" where student athletes are invited to present a game ball, helmet, or jersey to a staff member who has made a positive impact on their lives, creating a meaningful experience for both students and faculty; and the Fusion Event, successfully organized entirely by the International Explorers Club, providing a student-led festival featuring vendors, arts, and crafts. Dean Watkins shared updates from the Soaring Supporters meeting where committees were established for fundraising, decorations, staff appreciation, and student recognition. Additionally, Dean Watkins shared information about the EmBRACE award, sponsored by Redemption Orthodontics, to recognize a student for demonstrating boldness,

resilience, altruism, compassion, and empathy. The chosen recipient will receive an award, a certificate, \$250, and dinner for their family.

NEW BUSINESS

a. Enrollment Update

Update provided by Principal Oliveri. At the time of this memorandum, there were 323 students enrolled. The following data is reflective of the updated information shared at the board meeting with a total of 322 students enrolled at TCA: 93 students in 9th grade, 107 students in 10th grade, 87 students in 11th grade, and 36 students in 12th grade.

ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION

a. Salary Increase Allotment Proposal – Dr. Barbara Wills

Board approval was requested for the Salary Increase Allocation distribution plan presented for the 2025-2026 school year. The allocation includes \$118,155.15 for maintenance allocation for existing salaries from prior year increases and \$9,325.85 to be divided equally among all eligible TCA employees (instructional personnel) as a permanent increase to their annual salaries.

b. Academic Goals for 2025-2026

Board approval was requested for the proposed academic achievement goals for the 2025–2026 school year. The target goals reflect incremental percentage increases over the previous year's baselines: ELA from 77% to 79%, Math from 62% to 64%, Science from 98% to 99%, and Social

Studies from 94% to 95%. As TCA is a high-performing school, the percentage increases are modest, representing continued growth within an already strong academic standing.

Item Description

This item requests approval of the projected enrollment numbers for Tallahassee Collegiate Academy for 2026-2027.

Overview and Background

As outlined in the charter agreement between Tallahassee State College and Tallahassee Collegiate Academy, the school will provide the preliminary projected enrollment for the following school year to the charter school sponsor. The preliminary projected enrollment does not constitute a cap on the school's enrollment; it serves as a goal.

Projected Enrollment for the 2026-2027 includes enrolling 100 9th graders and to fill open seats in the 10th grade. Open seats in the 11th and 12th grade will be available for students who are ready for full-time dual enrollment. The total projected enrollment for 2026-2027 is 395.

Overview and Background

In accordance with Florida Statute 1002.33(9) the governing board of the charter school shall annually adopt and maintain an operating budget. The Local Education Agency (LEA) and School monitors the operating fund activity to ensure approved budget limits are maintained. This form is provided in accordance with Statute, which requires charter schools to provide annual financial report and program cost report information in the state-required formats for reporting.

The 25-26 budget is based on an enrollment of 357 students and using the Florida Department of Education revenue generating formula for charter schools. The budget maintains a 5% contingency and a balanced budget.

SUBJECT: TCA Budget Amendment

Item Description

This item requests approval of a budget amendment for the 2025-26 fiscal year, based on updated enrollment from the DOE Survey-2 Data. Enrollment was reported at 323 FTE, and the original projection was 357 FTE. This budget amendment will reduce the schools operating budget by \$231,555, from \$3,094,895 to \$2,863,340. The school will continue to operate within budget.

Overview and Background

In accordance with Florida Statute1002.33(9) the governing board of the charter school shall annually adopt and maintain an operating budget. The LEA and School monitors the operating fund activity to ensure approved budget limits are maintained. The 2025-2026 proposed budget was based on an enrollment of 357 students using the Florida Department of Education revenue generating formula for charter schools. The budget amendment maintains a 5% contingency and a balanced budget.

Funding/ Financial Implications

This reduces the TCA annual operating budget by \$231,555.

Item Description

This item presents the Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements for Tallahassee Collegiate Academy for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024.

Overview and Background

In accordance with Florida Statute 218.391, the governing board of the charter school created an audit selection committee responsible for issuing a request for proposal for auditing services (RFP 2024-03 TCA Auditing Services) and to select an audit entity. On June 3, 2024, the Committee chose James Moore & Company.

In accordance with Florida Statute 218.39, the report was provided to the TCA Finance Committee of the TCA governing board on October 23, 2025. James Moore & Company reported no findings, and determined that "financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities and each major fund of the School, as of June 30, 2024, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America".
